

For me, the most memorable experience was the class performance preparation. I learnt how to get my classmates' attention by observing my coaches - I just had to ask. If I stayed in primary school, I don't think that I would have had that opportunity to improve my leadership. I also learnt that I could communicate my thoughts and feelings quite well. I use phrases like 'I felt', 'What I think', etc. which feels more objective while avoiding saying things like 'You were', 'I know', etc. which can come off as quite offensive and mean. Overall, EFL made me more self-aware.


